DOJ Guidelines - qualifying cases expanded

Also allows for prosecutor signoff "for violent crimes or attempts to commit violent crimes other than homicide or sexual offenses" AND "It also includes other serious crimes and criminal offenses designated by a GG service for which investigative use of its service by law enforcement has been authorized by that service."

DOJ guidelines apply when: 1) DOJ has exclusive/concurrent jurisdiction 2) DOJ is supplying funding to conduct FGG 3) DOJ employees/contractors conduct genealogical research/investigative leads 4) Any agency that receives grant funding from the DOJ to conduct FGG.
